NOTICE OF INTENT TO FILL CITY COUNCIL VACANCY BY APPOINTMENT

The City of Thompson is seeking individuals to fill a vacancy on our City Council.

The City of Thompson, Winnebago County, Iowa has a vacancy on the city council as of December 31, 2021, due to the resignation of council person, A. Richter that was submitted October 12, 2021, to be effective December 31, 2021.

Pursuant to Section 372.13 of the Code of Iowa, notice is hereby given that the City Council of Thompson, Winnebago County, Iowa, intends to fill this vacancy by appointment during their next regular city council meeting that will be held at Thompson City Hall at 5:30 pm on Tuesday, February 15, 2022. However, the electors of the City of Thompson have the right to file a petition requiring that the vacancy be filled by special election. If electors wish to require a special election, a valid petition requesting a special election must be filed with the city clerk within fourteen days after publication of this notice or within fourteen days after the appointment is made. If no such petition is filed, the appointment shall be for the period until the next pending election as defined in Section 69.12 of the Code of Iowa.

Eligible electors of the City of Thompson, Winnebago County, Iowa, wanting to be considered for appointment should submit a request in writing to the city clerk's office by 12 pm on Wednesday, February 9, 2022.

CITY OF THOMPSON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS January 10, 2022

The Thompson City Council met in regular session on Monday, January 10, 2022 at 5:30 in the Clerk's Office at City Hall.

Mayor Hauan called the meeting to order. Members present: Willert, Flo, Chapman, and Flenner. Citizens Present: Steve Olson – Fire Chief, Terry Durby

A motion was made by Flo, seconded by Chapman to approve the agenda, claims and minutes. 4-0

Steve Olson was present to discuss the purchase of two (2) different trucks purchased by the Fire Dept., the discussion with the Mayor and Council was as how the ownership of these vehicles would be handled. The decision was tabled until after the meeting was held at the Fire Dept.

Terry Durby – Thompson Holdings, was present to discuss with the Council an opportunity for a Housing Grant for the School House Apartments, Mayor Hauan abstained from this discussion from 5:55 p.m. until 6:15 p.m. due to being ownership in Thompson Holdings, which has no bearing on the relationship of the Grant between the parties involved, this was a personal choice. Mayor Pro Tem Willert and the Council discussed and have decided to move forward with the application of the Housing Grant for the School, which is of absolutely no cost what so ever to the City, the City of Thompson is simply a "pass through entity" for the Grant, any and all costs are and will be incurred by Thompson Holdings.

A motion was made by Flo, seconded by Chapman to approve the application of the Housing Grant to move forward. 4-0

A motion was made by Fleener, seconded by Willert to approve the liquor license for the Branding Iron. 4-0

A motion was made by Chapman, seconded by Flo to change the date of the February regular meeting to Tuesday, February 15th, due to a conflict with some council members for the 14th. 4-0

A motion was made by Chapman, seconded by Willert setting the date of the Max Levy Public Hearing for 2-15-22. 4-0

The FY 22/23 Budget was discussed with very few changes needed.

A motion was made by Fleener, seconded by Chapman to approve the use of the BC Tribune as the City of Thompson's Official Newspaper. 4-0

Matt Beckman was present to discuss City issues: Lift station repairs were made, Well #1 is one-line, Punch list is being completed @ WTP. Water Leak was fixed on 5 Lynn that has been leaking for some time.

Misc: The City will be posting a vacancy on the Council and receiving letters for review.

Mayor/Council discussion: Equipment updates were discussed, pickup updates were discussed, possi-

ble down size of unused equipment traded for needed equipment.

A motion was made by Willert, seconded by Flo to adjourn the meeting at 6:48 pm. 4-0
